

CHAPTER 7-3

NUMBERING SYSTEM; DESIGNATED STREET NUMBER FOR BUILDINGS

*Charter references: Powers and construction, § 1.12(b)(3), (7), (9), (11), (24), (41).

Cross references: Streets and Sidewalks, Chapter 7-1.

Section 7-3-1. Legislative finding.

Whereas, there are no numbered buildings in the City of Guyton, and whereas it is desirable to create a numbering system whereby each building located in the City of Guyton shall be numbered so that the location of each building shall be easily determined for the general welfare, convenience and safety of the inhabitants of the City of Guyton.

(¶ 1, "An Ordinance creating a numbering system whereby each building in the City of Guyton shall have a designated street number," November 12, 1985.)

Section 7-3-2. Each Building Numbered.

It is hereby ordained by the authority of the City Council that each building located in the City of Guyton be numbered and that the numbers for each building now in the City of Guyton be in accordance with the schedule which is marked Exhibit "A" and attached hereto and by express reference made a part hereof, and which Exhibit "A" shows the name of each street and the name of the occupant of each building on each street.

(¶ 2, "An Ordinance creating a numbering system whereby each building in the City of Guyton shall have a designated street number," November 12, 1985.)

[NOTE: Exhibit "A" is on file with the City Clerk, and is a list of the street numbers as initiated by this ordinance.]

Section 7-3-3. Newly constructed buildings.

Each building hereafter constructed or located in the City of Guyton shall be numbered in accordance with numbers assigned thereto by City Council and such numbers shall be affixed to each building prior to final inspection is made.

(¶ 3, "An Ordinance creating a numbering system whereby each building in the City of Guyton shall have a designated street number," November 12, 1985.)

Section 7-3-4. Required materials.

The numbers shall be made of reflective metal material, unless other provisions are made by Owner by written application approved by the Historic Preservation Commission for the City of Guyton.

(¶4, "An Ordinance creating a numbering system whereby each building in the City of Guyton shall have a designated street number," November 12, 1985.)

Section 7-3-5. Size.

Each number shall be at least three inches (3") in height and two and one-half (2 ½") in width and no larger than five inches (5") in height and four and one-half inches (4 ½") in width.

(¶ 5, "An Ordinance creating a numbering system whereby each building in the City of Guyton shall have a designated street number," November 12, 1985.)

Section 7-3-6. Owner's responsibility.

It shall be the responsibility of each building owner to obtain and affix said numbers to the owner's building at a prominent place which shall be visible from the street in front of the building.

(¶ 6, "An Ordinance creating a numbering system whereby each building in the City of Guyton shall have a designated street number," November 12, 1985.)

Section 7-3-7. Deadline.

Each building owner in the City of Guyton shall have three (3) months from the date hereof [November 12, 1985] in which to have said number affixed to the owner's building.

(¶ 7, "An Ordinance creating a numbering system whereby each building in the City of Guyton shall have a designated street number," November 12, 1985.)

Section 7-3-8. Penalties.

Failure of any building owner to abide by this chapter shall be subject to a fine of not more than One Hundred Dollars (\$100.00) and a jail sentence of not more than ten (10) days.

Section 7-3-9. Severability.

Invalidation of any part of this chapter shall not affect the validity of the remaining portions hereof.
